Luv E. Lamb thought very hard. “I know. I can count the stars.”

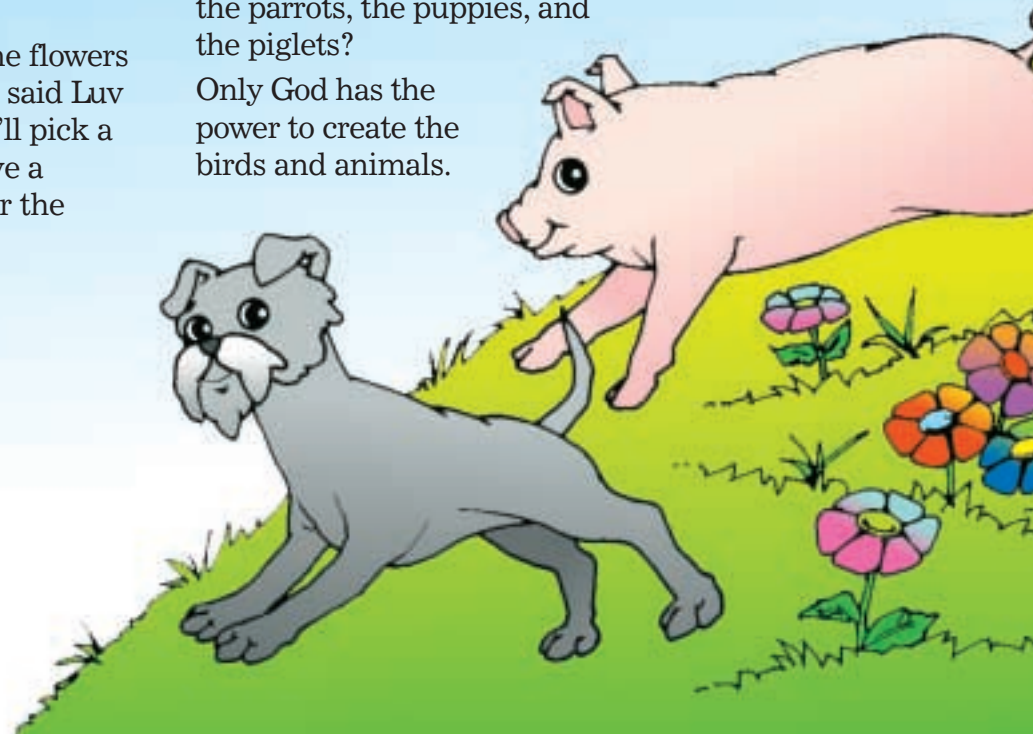
“No, there are too many stars,” said Cubbie.

By His power, God created all things. On day five, God created the birds and the fish. On day six, God created the animals.

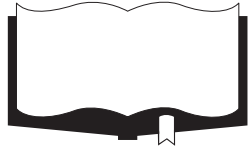
God created many different kinds of birds.

Seagulls live near the water.

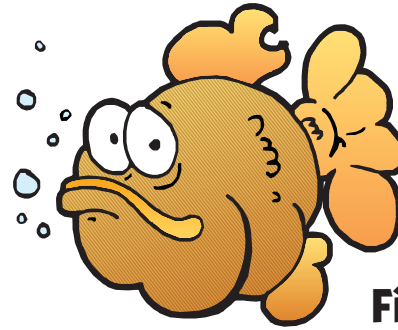
Some birds live in the jungle.

Some animals live in the jungle, desert, or forest.

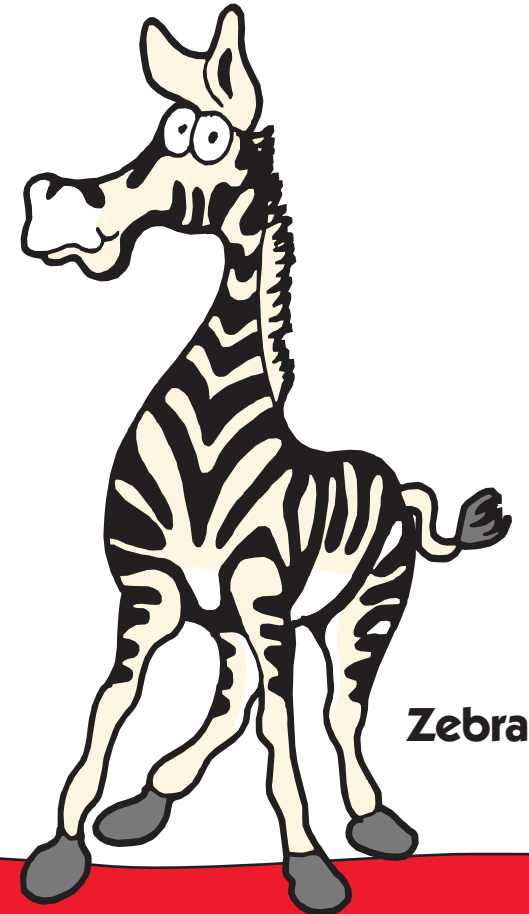
God created each one of these by His power.

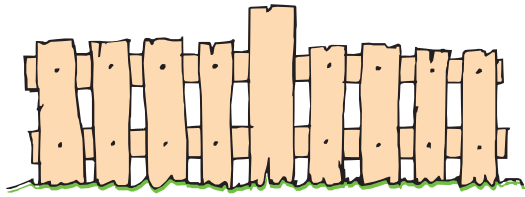
